Freedom for Riders

The New Freedom Transportation Program is a voucher program developed to provide transportation options for persons with disabilities and transportation barriers. Funding is provided by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation New Freedom Grant and Center for Independent Living.

Here's How it Works:

If you qualify for the New Freedom Transportation Program you will get vouchers to spend on a portion of your transportation costs. You may choose your own driver, or you may ride with a commercial transportation provider who has been pre-approved by the voucher transportation program. You arrange your ride and pay your driver with a voucher. Your driver will submit the voucher to the Center for Independent Living for Western Wisconsin, Inc. for payment.

The Mission of the Center for Independent Living for Western Wisconsin, Inc. is to advocate for and with persons with a disability to exercise their right to full participation in society.



Volunteer Drivers Needed

The New Freedom Transportation Program is currently accepting applications for volunteer drivers who will provide one-on-one transportation service. Mileage is paid by current federal rate to drivers to transport consumers in their own vehicles to classes, social gatherings, medical or other appointments. Drivers are required to have a valid drivers license and proof of liability insurance. Drivers will receive an orientation, training and recognition!
